

Australian National Junior Coach

Position: Australian National Junior Coach

Time Period: November 2011 to September 2012.

Job Requirements:

- Coach the Australian Junior Squad and Junior World Championships team.
 This includes leading training and coaching of the squad/team, and liaise and provide technical assistance to the individual coaches and the squad/team members to assist in their development as orienteers.
- Provide leadership nationally on the development of competition, training and infrastructure to support and guide the development of Australia's best junior orienteers.
- As National Junior Coach, be a member of the High Performance
 Management Group and a leader in decision making related to the development of junior orienteering in Australia.
- Organise at least one national training camp for the squad annually in Australia as well as the pre-JWOC training camp overseas.
- Work with stakeholders in identifying junior orienteers who demonstrate both orienteering and physical ability to be future high performance orienteers.
- Liaise with the National Junior Manager, Manager High Performance and High Performance Operations manager with respect to the preparation of Junior World Championships Teams.
- Be on the selection committee for the Junior World Championships and other junior representative teams, such as Oceania and Australian v New Zealand challenges.
- Develop an understanding of current trends and development in orienteering coaching internationally and assist, through the OA Manager Coaching & Officiating Development, in promulgating this information to other Australian coaches..
- Be an ex officio member of the OA Coaching Committee.
- Represent OA at national and international coaching meetings, workshops etc. as determined by mutual agreement with the Board.
- Liaise with the coaches of other representative teams with respect to the preparation of the Junior members of these teams.

- Ideally a record of successful individual coaching of junior orienteers and junior orienteering teams/squads
- Appropriate Level 2 Orienteering Coaching qualifications are desirable.
- Relevant experience in leading, managing and/or administering sporting groups.
- Proven high-level communication skills in working in both group environments and in one-on-one situations.
- The capacity for flexibility and adaptability in dealing with challenging environments.

- Undertake the co-ordination of squad/team travel arrangements within and outside Australia.
- Prepare & distribute detailed itineraries for transport to and from the event venue, for squad/team activities.
- Liaise with the Director, Finance to ensure the effective acquittal of financial arrangements for squad/team activities within budgetary requirements.
- Manage the financial records of squad/team activities.
- Arrange for the supply of official uniforms and equipment for the National Junior Team in conjunction with the Operations Manager, High Performance.
- Assist with publicity for the squad/team in conjunction with the Operations Manager, High Performance.
- Maintain records of meetings, interviews and conversations appropriate to squad/team activities.
- Assist in the coaching of the Australian Junior Squad and Junior World Championships team.
- As National Junior Manager/Assistant Coach, be a member of the High Performance Management
